DePaul offers education programs for professionals who work with children with hearing loss including: audiologists, speech language pathologists, teachers of the deaf, service coordinators, classroom teachers, early childhood educators.

DePaul takes an active role in educating the professional community about auditory-oral education for children who are deaf or hard of hearing.

Exhibits

DePaul exhibits at conferences and meetings to educate the general public, parents and professional groups about auditory-oral education and about DePaul's programs and services for children who are deaf or hard of hearing. Informational and educational materials are provided and exhibits are staffed by DePaul professionals.

In-Service Training

DePaul professionals provide in-service training to professionals working with children with hearing loss.

Presentations

DePaul's professionals are experts in auditory-oral education. Our audiologists, speech language pathologists and certified teachers of the deaf give presentations to professional groups, community groups, and universities. Topics include, but are not limited to:

- hearing loss identification
- auditory development for children with hearing loss
 - auditory-oral education
 - cochlear implant rehabilitation
- maximizing auditory speech potential for children who are deaf or hard of hearing
 - speech and language development

Transition Training

As students transition from DePaul School for Hearing and Speech to mainstream educational settings DePaul provides training and support to the receiving school/school district.
